It was a unanimous vote of the Board to insert an article in the 1957 warrant pertaining to the study of garbage collection for the Town.

The following common victualler applications were approved: Blue Lantern, Inc., Outpost, Inc., Bliss Corner Fruit Mart, Yvonne's Inc., Pop's Lunch and Chippy's.

It was a majority vote of the Board that the previous minutes concerning Manchester Lane, North Dartmouth be recinded and a new letter be mailed to the Planning Board and Building Inspector concerning this subdivision.
