12/29/58

On December 2, 1958, Mr. Manuel Correia opened the Town Dump gate while on vacation. Another hearing would be held. The Board

On 12/3/58 Mr. Stevens reported to the office that he posted several small no dumping signs on Pauline St., N.D. and property.

On 12/8/58 Mr. Dunn reported to the office that Mr. Arthur Vello is not creating any nuisance by dumping his cesspool waste on the Sylvia property located on Slocum Road, N.D.

On 12/8/58 Mr. Dunn reported to the office that only excess water is located on McCabe St., S.D. The only solution is surface drains and this is not a Board of Health matter. HEALTH

Mr. Arnold Tefft informed the office that he will do the plumbing in the trailer located on Chase Rd., N.D. owned by Mr. Edward Faber. YEAR

Dr. Fortin, School Dentist, called the office to report the dental x-ray machine is not working properly. He will have the machine repaired in the new year.

On 12/18/58 Mr. Dunn reported to the office that several residents on Coggeshall St., N.D. reported to him that Mrs. Peter Cesolini, 69 Coggeshall St., N.D. was dumping her garbage and rubbish in an empty lot across from her home. Mr. Dunn warned Mrs. Cesolini to refrain from this practice.
