

Monday November 1, 2021:

- removed inmates from bunks 17 and 13 for covid

Tuesday November 2, 2021:

- removed inmate with liver failure for covid whom resided between inmates removed for covid previous day from bunk 16
- No covid testing nor temperature testing for remaining detainees

Wednesday November 3, 2021:

- at approximately 9:04 am, unnamed Lieutenant, carries into GC unit, an enormous white purell machine containing large quantity of hand sanitizer for the two officers on unit, which he then places behind the control desk for unit officers on the dais; yet no medical nor sanitation measures made for detainees whom remain less than 6-feet from each other.
- at approximately 10:23 am, Mental health came to the unit to see detainees in a blue mesh haz-mat scrub, which covered the entire frontal of her uniform. It should be noted that no such haz-mat scrubs have been handed to the detainees; nor have we received new masks nor cleaning supplies such as chemicals, bleach, disinfectants, etc.
- at approximately 10:43 am, while Lt. behind C/O dais, unit officer pulls out blue mesh haz-mat suit; which indicates that jail has a surplus of said suits and refuses to distribute them to the detainee population, showing deliberate indifference to our health in violation of U.S.C. 42 Sec 1983 and Youngberg v. Romeo (duty and standard of care)
- at 1:13 pm, 3 medical staff conduct rapid 15-minute Covid testing, I was tested at 2:01 pm and received my negative result at 2:20 pm. Test was conducted in the tier and results were visible to all inmates. Testing was voluntary and I was refused a copy of the results by medical staff.
- After Covid testing was concluded on second shift before 4pm, at least 5 individuals whom tested positive were removed from GC unit and placed in quarantine in the RSU (restricted housing unit). Multiple inmates refused testing for covid and were allowed to stay on unit and possibly infect others.

Sunday November 7, 2021:

- an inmate whom was sick, was tested by a nurse for covid at 8:27 am; said detainee had previously tested negative on Wednesday November 3rd, 2021. He was then sent back to his bunk GC #55 and allowed to further possibly infect the unit at 8:30 am
- Same detainee was laying on floor on the unit by C/O Dais from approximately 9:15 am until 9:30 am, at which point the nurse walked in unit, saw the detainee on the floor, refused him medical attention and proceeded to conduct medpass.
- Same detainee from bunk #55, was removed from unit via wheelchair by C/O [REDACTED] at approximately 9:35am
- At approximately 9:37am another inmate collapsed at the medcart during GC Medpass. The same nurse whom refused medical treatment to detainee on bunk #55, refused medical initially to inmate whom collapsed at medcart (inmate was from bunk #10).
- at approximately 9:40am 3 nurses and multiple C/O's arrived to take detainee from bunk #10 to medical, the responding staff fabricate story that detainee was lactose intolerent and collapsed from drinking milk.
- at approximately 4pm, nurses provide voluntary testing for temperatures, Mine was taking at

4:15pm

- at approximately 4:55pm, voluntary covid testing was conducted in doorway of nurses station. Results were withheld from detainees per medical supervisors.
- at 7:02pm, 12 detainees, including some whom refused testing for covid on Wednesday November 3rd, 2021, received notification that they tested positive for covid 19. At least three of these detainees had been on the phone earlier with their families and had contacted channel 12 news; those individuals were refused by medical to review the results of their test and one of them was told by their mother that she contacted the jail regarding the covid situation and was told by medical staff that there was no covid in the jail and that anyone calling home whom said otherwise was lying and making sympathy calls. I did not test positive for covid-19.
- again the covid tests on Sunday November 7th, 2021 were voluntary and multiple people were allowed to refuse testing and still reside on the unit, potentially spreading the virus to others.

Monday November 8, 2021:

- Move detainees from HB to GB unit to make room for new detainees from courts
- GC Unit not cleansed nor sanitized despite the removal of 14 detainees from the day before for covid-19 positive test

Tuesday November 9, 2021:

- detainee from bunk #62 complains of sickness during medpass at approximately 9:40am. detainee test positive and is removed at 9:55 and shown results immediately. Should be noted that same detainee tested negative on Sunday November 7, 2021, and that his results on Sunday November 7, 2021, were withheld from him. Also, the detainees whom refused to take a covid test continue to be on GC unit and possibly infecting entire unit.
- Unit not cleansed with chemicals due to Covid-19 outbreak with chemicals
- Nurse makes joke regarding how milk made detainee [REDACTED] pass out in front of medcart during medpass at 9:37am on Sunday November 7, 2021. This is the same nurse whom refused medical attention initially to [REDACTED] knew that another inmate fell and hit his head on Saturday November 6, 2021 and did not give him medical attention, and the same nurse who left detainee Cagel on the ground without medical attention and conducted medpass on Sunday November 7, 2021

Wednesday November 10, 2021:

- Unit not cleansed for covid-19 with chemicals
- Nurses and civilian staff all wearing blue hazmat suits over clothes. Should be noted that unit has been in lockdown since Tuesday November 2, 2021, and civilian staff and nurses have been entering and leaving quarantined unit not following protocols.

Side Notes:

- The sentenced convicts from unit 2 west are now working in the kitchen due to a lockdown of the workers block of sentenced inmates 1 west. None of the workers of 1 west and 2 west have

been given test to ensure that they do not have Covid -19 before they are allowed to handle food in violation of CMR's (Code of Massachusetts Regulations)

928.03: Health Protection For Inmates and Staff (Required)

Written policy and procedure shall provide for adequate health protection for all inmates and staff in the facility and inmates and other persons working in food service. Such health protection shall include:

(1) Prior to job assignment, all food service workers receive a medical examination, to ensure freedom from diarrhea, skin infections, acute respiratory infections, or any diseases or other illnesses transmissible through food, water or utensils. Every food service worker shall have a medical examination prior to returning to work after a substantial illness; and

(2) All food service workers shall maintain a high degree of personal cleanliness, wear clean outer garments while working and wash their hands upon reporting to duty and after using the toilet facilities.

REGULATORY AUTHORITY

103 CMR 928.00: M. G.L. c. 124, § (1), (c), (d) and (q); c. 127, §§ 1A and 1B.

- The BCHOC has refused to adhere to the CDC Guidelines regarding Covid-19 and still has yet to provide consecutive conclusive tests for the detainee population to ensure that the virus is not unsuspectingly spread throughout the institution

974.01: General

Each facility shall comply with applicable regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health, as required by statute, regarding maintenance and sanitation in county correctional facilities.

REGULATORY AUTHORITY

103 CMR 974.00: M. G.L. c. 124, § (1), (c), (d), (q) and (r); c. 127, §§ 1A and 1B.

- The BCHOC does not identify whom the Environmental Health Officer is, nor does that designated individual adhere to the CMR's nor CDC Guidelines regarding Covid-19 as evidence by the facts above

974.02: Environmental Health Officer (Required)

In accordance with Department of Public Health regulations, each Sheriff/facility administrator shall appoint a qualified environmental health officer to ensure that 103 CMR 900.00 and the regulations of the Department of Public Health (105 CMR) are adhered to and properly monitored.

REGULATORY AUTHORITY

103 CMR 974.00: M. G.L. c. 124, § (1), (c), (d), (q) and (r); c. 127, §§ 1A and 1B.

- The BCHOC and it's agents and staff, refuse to adhere to the CMR's an dCDC Guidelines regarding the safety and health of the detainees, specifically the refusal to utilize the resources to assure that the living areas of the detainees, especially those unsentenced, are kept clean and sanitized as evidenced above

974.03: Interior Cleanliness

A written housekeeping plan for all areas of the facility's physical plant shall provide for daily housekeeping and regular maintenance, by assigning duties and responsibilities to staff and inmates.

REGULATORY AUTHORITY
